





Nassau County has the 2nd lowest unemployment rate in The CareerSource Northeast Florida region with St. Johns County having the lowest at 2.3%


March 2023, nonagricultural employment in the Jacksonville MSA increased 5.1% over the year.

Mining, Logging, and Construction; Information; Professional and Business Services; Manufacturing; Financial Activities; Trade, Transportation, and Utilities; and Government industries grew faster in the metro area than statewide over the year.

Jacksonville MSA was tied for the highest annual job growth compared to all the metro areas in the state in the Manufacturing industry (+2,000 jobs).

There were no lost jobs over the year.
